Liturgist: Christ, we come to the empty tomb, we see our own death, we see our own tomb, we see our own emptiness. And we remember how we have treated other people-members of our family, friends, and neighbors.

All: Lord, we come to your tomb, we see a hungry world before us, the pain of starving children, the guilt of war in our hands, and we know that collectively we share in those injustices.

All: Thanks be to God.
